Classroom Updates

Elementary

Now that the students know how to navigate a work cycle with individualized work plans, we asked them to practice advancing through addition work at their own pace. Each student was able to show growth whether that was being less reliant on manipulatives or adding up to 4 digit numbers with regrouping.



Students have also been excited to learn how to tell time on an analog clock. Ask them to show you their new abilities.

Through exposure, students have become more comfortable with reading and writing. They understand that both are ways to communicate and are growing every day in their skills. We have been focusing on legibility and the conventions of a sentence for all and paragraph writing for our older students.

The students have loved learning about the Earth in our science unit. They have researched volcanoes and earthquakes, and continue to be eager to learn more about our beautiful planet. We continued our study of plants in this unit with a lesson from our Green Steps Mentor and a lesson with Ranger Stacey at Sesqui State Park. You will see the fruition of their learning when they complete the planting around campus soon.

Through our world cultures study of Asia, the students have explored China and India and were excited to get their passport stamps. We will be heading to Japan next and then Russia. If you have visited Japan or Russia, we'd love to have you talk with our students. Please reach out.



Preschool

Our mornings begin with a Montessori work cycle, where students dive into writing, phonics, and math through hands-on manipulatives and games. Lately, the children have been captivated by both handwriting and mammals! While working through the Handwriting Without Tears letters, the students recently learned about the "Magic C" (C can keep going to make a circle, or an O or a Q, or it can form a G). They've fallen in love with the "Magic C Bunny," a fun character I create with my hand and a piece of tissue paper. The children enjoy following the Magic C Bunny's instructions to make different letters and love showing off their work.

This group of students is so inquisitive, and the highlight of our academic year so far has been our mammal unit. The children use their new scientific knowledge to determine which animals are mammals during playtime and sing songs about their furry friends during music. Mammals have become a favorite topic of study, with the children excitedly identifying every animal they see as a mammal or not a mammal—even imaginary creatures like Totoro! It's been such an exciting blend of creativity, science, and fun!

In art, the students have been exploring the elements of Line and Shape, creating their own drawings based on these principles.

Brightwheel Tips & Tricks

It is essential that you check your child in using the QR code each morning and to check your child out each afternoon. You can edit the pin by clicking on the pencil.
